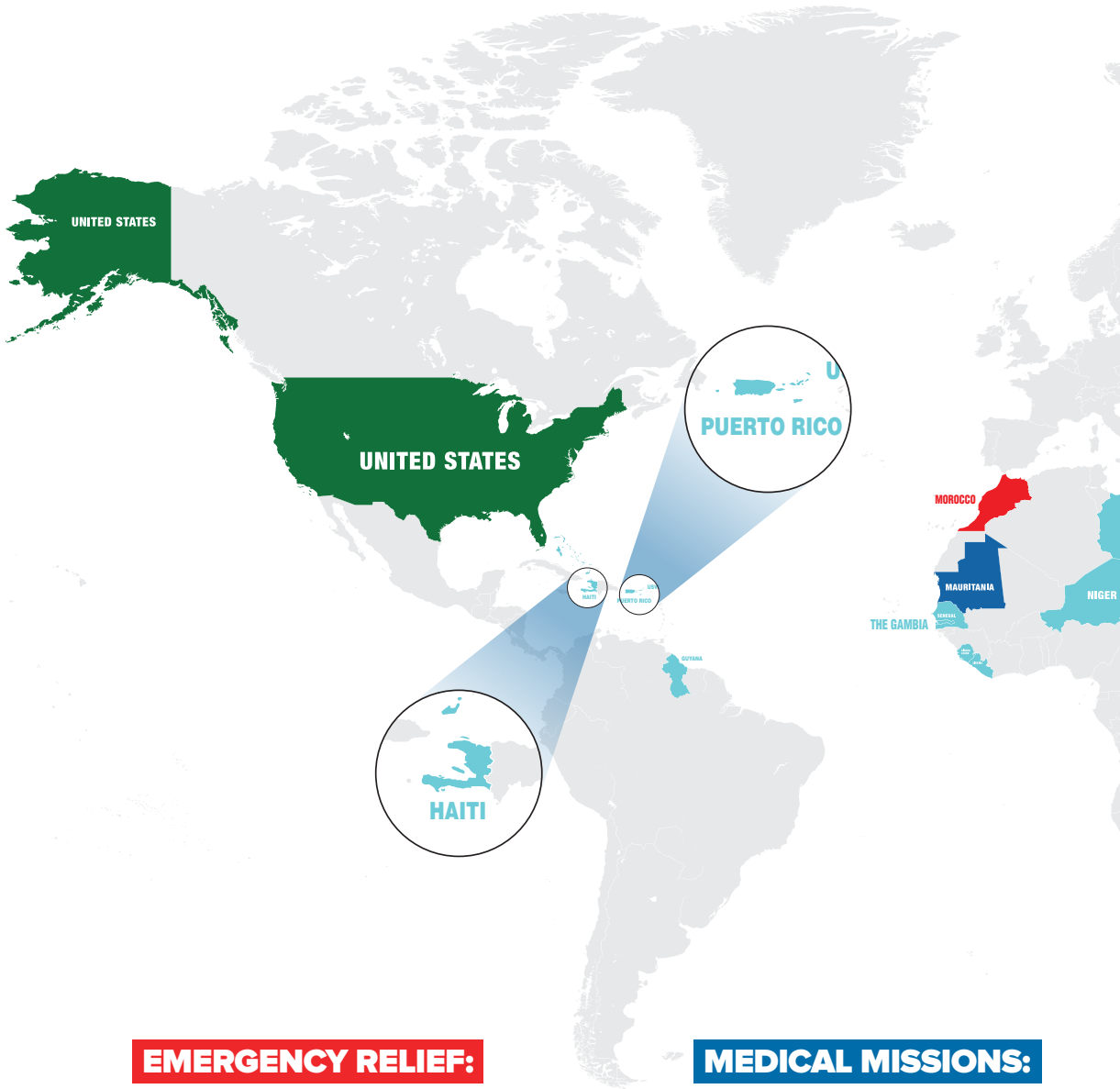

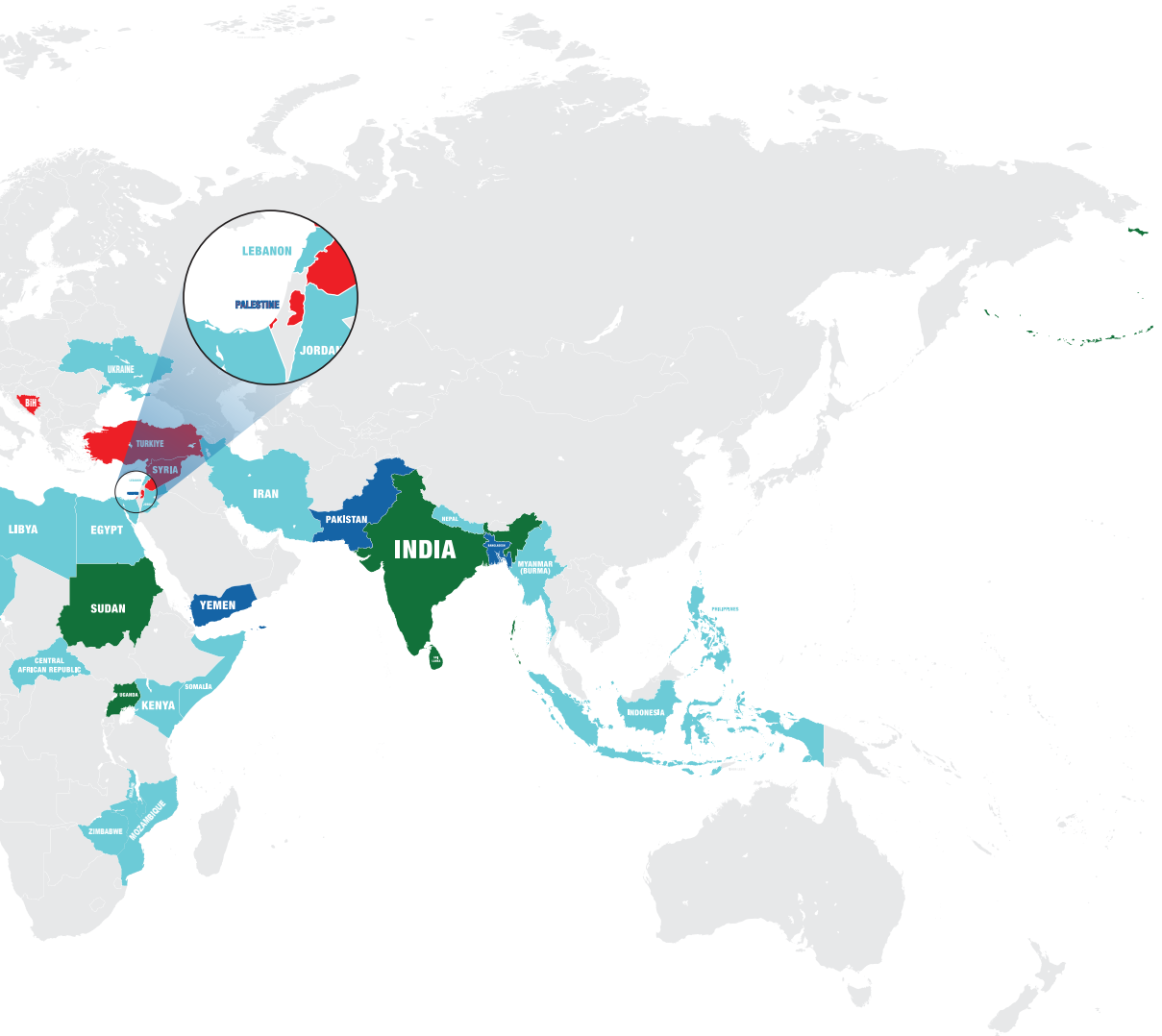

Celebrating Relocation with Meaningful Discussions

With IMANA's headquarters officially relocating to the Northern Virginia-Washington, D.C. area at the start of 2024, IMANA leadership convened in Fairfax, VA to engage in strategic collaboration & planning through the exchange of innovative ideas and energizing discussions. These conversations guided and reinforced IMANA's mission towards impactful humanitarian work.

Following the meeting, IMANA also hosted a dinner that was attended by community leaders, our partners, volunteers, and supporters as well as the IMANA leadership and staff. This event served as a platform not only for IMANA's relocation announcement, but also allowed everyone in attendance to engage in meaningful conversations and network.



Strengthening Bonds

Eid Celebration Lunch (April 17th in Washington, DC)

IMANA attended the annual Eid al-Fitr celebration lunch this year hosted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture Center for Faith Based and Neighborhood Partnerships and Islamic Relief. The event brought together Muslim American organizational partners as well as provided an opportunity to celebrate and connect during this important time.

Ophthalmology Dinner (October 19th in Chicago, IL)

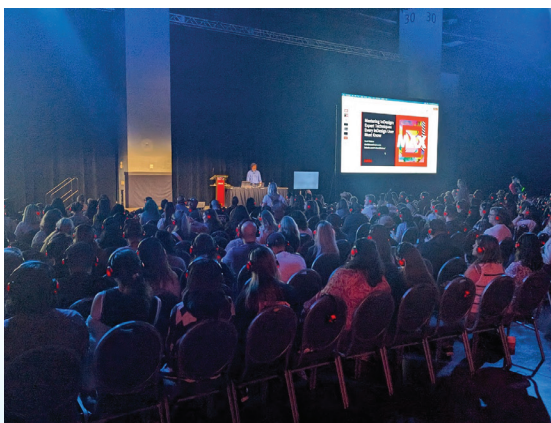
August 7-8 in Cape Town, South Africa

As the war in Gaza continued into 2024, our AidGaza campaign proved to be a vital initiative dedicated to addressing the dire humanitarian and healthcare needs of the people in Gaza. With a mission to alleviate suffering, restore dignity, and strengthen the region's healthcare infrastructure, the campaign has mobilized resources and partnerships on a global scale.



Medical Relief

IMANA's campaign has been pivotal in addressing the urgent healthcare needs of Gaza's population amidst the ongoing humanitarian crisis and destruction of its healthcare infrastructure.



In April 2024, a dedicated team of physicians traveled to Gaza via Egypt to provide critical medical support and aid. Led by Dr. Ismail Mehr, IMANA Medical Relief Chair and Board member, and assisted by our creative director, this emergency response team of four physicians worked tirelessly to address urgent medical needs, stabilize healthcare delivery, and bring hope to the people of Gaza.

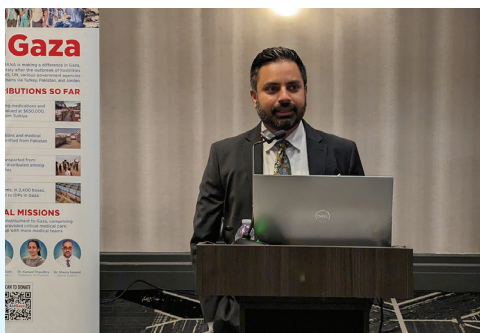

AidGaza *webinar*

Stories of Resilience and Life-Saving Care

IMANA's recent AidGaza Webinar featured four volunteer doctors who traveled to Gaza to provide critical medical care amidst conflict. Led by Dr. Ismail Mehr, the team included Dr. Shariq Sayeed (Vascular Surgery), Dr. Kanwal Shazia Chaudhry (Pediatrics/Emergency Medicine), and Dr. Azeem Elahi (Pulmonology).

The webinar shared emotional and powerful stories of treating patients under extreme conditions. The doctors recounted providing care to those severely injured in airstrikes, children suffering from chronic untreated illnesses, and families struggling with limited access to basic medical services.

"We saw immense pain, but also unimaginable resilience," said Dr. Elahi. Their mission highlighted the urgent need for continuous medical support to address the overwhelming demand for care.

Attendees were deeply moved by the team's firsthand experiences and had the opportunity to engage in a Q&A session to learn more about the challenges on the ground and the critical role of medical missions.

IMANA expressed gratitude to its volunteers and supporters, emphasizing that continued community contributions are essential to sustain life-saving efforts in Gaza.

AidAfghanistan

In a significant step toward addressing Afghanistan's healthcare needs, IMANA successfully delivered ten (10) Interagency Emergency Health Kits (IEHKs) to Kabul with logistical support from Alight Pakistan. Afghanistan's healthcare infrastructure has been severely affected by ongoing conflicts, economic instability, and limited access to medical supplies. The arrival of these IEHKs is a critical intervention, equipping clinics and healthcare workers with resources to treat injuries, infections, chronic conditions, and other health issues.



AidHaiti

With an aim to support Haiti's healthcare infrastructure, IMANA procured and airlifted two Interagency Emergency Health Kits (IEHKs) and two Temporary Emergency Surgical Kits (TESKs) to Port-au-Prince, Haiti. With ongoing challenges such as resource shortages, limited access to healthcare, and the aftermath of past disasters, the delivery of these kits will enhance the capacity of healthcare facilities to respond effectively to urgent medical needs. We partnered with local organizations to receive these kits and arranged for distribution locally.



AidBosnia

Following the devastation from floods in Bosnia and Herzegovina, IMANA's AidBosnia campaign aimed to provide essential medical support to the flood-affected regions. Working with our local partners we were able to fund the procurement of critical medicines and medical supplies aimed at bolstering healthcare facilities in areas hardest hit by recent flooding. These resources were distributed among hospitals in Jablanica, Konjic, Kreševo, and Fojnica regions.



AidUSA

In response to the challenges posed by severe winter weather, IMANA funded essential winter relief in Asheville, NC following the aftermath of Hurricane Helene that left many without critical resources to face the extreme weather conditions. The 300 winter kits that were distributed to families and individuals included blankets, beanies, gloves, socks, hand warmers, and foot warmers. Additionally, IMANA was also able to provide 50 grocery boxes, 53 heaters, 4 generators, and 21 humidifiers to the local communities to support them through the winter.



AidSyria

As we continued to make strides in providing much needed support to internally displaced persons (IDPs) in northern Syria, IMANA airlifted over 11,400 eyeglasses and accessories to support access to vision care, six pallets containing 7,680 hospital gowns, and a complete set of state-of-the-art laparoscopic equipment to IDP camps in Syria. We coordinated with our partners to deliver these supplies via Turkiye.



AidMorocco

IMANA, in collaboration with Africa Relief, funded the procurement of one of three critical care mobile clinics, each valued at \$220,000. These state-of-the-art clinics are designed to provide essential medical services to communities in Morocco that are still grappling with the aftermath of the devastating earthquake that struck the region in 2023. IMANA's Creative Director was present at the unveiling and handing-over ceremony, held in New Jersey during August. The deployment of these clinics is making a meaningful impact in Morocco.

IMANA continued its efforts in delivering free healthcare services to displaced and unregistered refugees, as well as other underserved communities in Jordan. This year, four volunteer teams traveled to Amman to serve the local communities in and around the city.

IMANA also sponsored and provided first aid cover to participants at the 2024 Sports Summit hosted by the Michigan Islamic Sports Association (MISA). Attended by IMANA's Medical Relief Chair and Executive Director, the event allowed young athletes to partake in both basketball and football skills camp promoting sportsmanship, physical activity, and community engagement among Muslim youth and families.

UGANDA (NEW)

Funding a Mobile Clinic

IMANA made a grant to Swiha Charity Foundation to procure and equip a van for use as a mobile clinic which will serve as a means to deliver medical services to remote areas where access to healthcare is limited, thereby addressing the significant gap in healthcare availability for vulnerable populations in these outlying regions.

This measure aims to improve access to timely and necessary medical services for individuals in urgent need, particularly those in remote or underserved areas where transportation to healthcare facilities can be a significant barrier.

Caring for Mothers, Delivering Hope

Our support for unregistered expectant Syrian refugee mothers in Istanbul continued through MA'AN Aid and Development Association. In 2024, 143 expectant mothers received full term care. This program provides comprehensive prenatal care, including regular check-ups, necessary medical tests, and support through delivery.

Providing Care for Autistic Children

Additionally, IMANA continued support for the Autistic Children Rehabilitation Project in Sanliurfa. Along with care for autism, this program offers interventions such as physiotherapy for conditions like cerebral palsy, cerebral atrophy, paralysis, and spinal cord injuries, as well as health education for families. In 2024, 478 beneficiaries were enrolled for these services.

Pakistan Primary Care Clinics

IMANA's continued support for Al-Mustafa Trust's (AMT) primary care clinics in Pakistan has been instrumental in providing critical healthcare services to underserved communities. Operating Orangi, Sillanwali, Umerkot, Pajjagai, Rera Bagh, these clinics serve as lifelines for local populations, offering free treatment and addressing a wide range of medical needs. Our grant included funds for electro medical equipment of their new center in Mityari, near Hyderabad

Eye Surgery Camps

Our vision care program, in collaboration with Dogar Welfare Trust's ophthalmology team, continued to be a cornerstone of vision care for rural communities in Pakistan. These camps have brought essential ophthalmologic services to underserved regions, including Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Gilgit-Baltistan and Azad Kashmir. In addition to performing cataract surgeries, the team also provided other minor treatments and routine eye care.

Nutrition Project

Our project in the village of Wah Burira near Sukkur is meant to develop a sustainable program to address childhood malnutrition through education, prevention, and treatment, and by addressing the socioeconomic and environmental roots of malnutrition. It focuses on:

- Management of Acute Malnutrition in Infants (MAMI; kids under 6 months)
- Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM)
- Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM)
- Pregnant and Lactating Women (PLWs)

609 infants and children, and 328 PLWs benefited from the program.

Providing Long-Term Healthcare

While providing primary care through a number of mobile clinics, we recognized the long-term healthcare needs of the region. The mobile clinic was converted into a permanent facility. The establishment of this clinic marked a significant step forward in ensuring sustained medical access for a population that had endured both the immediate impacts of the earthquake and the challenges of displacement and conflict.

Bangladesh Restoring Vision, Changing Lives

Throughout 2024, our impactful partnership with the BDesh Foundation provided complimentary cataract surgeries to individuals in remote and underserved areas of Bangladesh. Rooted in the shared mission of addressing the significant gap in access to healthcare for vulnerable populations, this initiative provides eye care where access is limited. 754 free cataract surgeries were successfully performed.

Reaching the Most Vulnerable

Our community clinics in Uganda, in collaboration with the Kiryandongo Muslim District Council (KMDC), has made remarkable strides in bringing essential healthcare services to underserved and remote communities. This program provided free treatment to 35,611 patients in Omoro, Nwoya, Oyam, Masindi, Buliisa, Kikuube, Kyankwanzi, and Kagadi districts.

Bridging Gaps in Healthcare

The IMANA- sponsored Ummah Clinic remained at the forefront of providing essential and affordable healthcare services to the local population in Athulugama throughout 2024. Situated in a region where healthcare accessibility is often limited, the clinic has been instrumental in addressing the medical needs of the underserved. These services provided 22,621 patients with essential healthcare this past year.

Clarkston Community Health Center

IMANA provided a grant to the Clarkston Community Health Center in Atlanta, GA to support its operations to enhance care for patients with chronic conditions such as diabetes and hypertension. This charitable clinic serves a high percentage of uninsured individuals and families in the local community.

American Muslim Community Clinic

We also provided a grant to support the costs of medical and dental services at the American Muslim Community Clinic in Orlando, FL. This community clinic is run by the American Muslims Social Services and provides free primary and specialty medical care, dental services, behavioral health counseling, lab services, and prescription assistance to uninsured and homeless individuals in Seminole, Orange, and Osceola counties.

RAMADAN MEALS PROGRAM

Nourishing Communities:

During Ramadan, IMANA partnered with multiple organizations globally to provide food packages and healthy iftar meals in several countries. This distribution makes a significant difference in the lives of those facing poverty, displacement, or food insecurity during Ramadan; ensuring that fasting individuals can observe the holy month without the added burden of worrying about where their next meal will come from.

Exploring New Frontiers

In 2024, IMANA aimed to work on expanding our Medical Relief program to underserved regions in Central and South America. With help of local NGOs, we were able to conduct exploratory visits to Guyana and Guatemala to assess the needs and feasibility of conducting medical and surgical missions.

Guyana (January 2024)

With an initial goal of extending our primary care missions to Guyana, our Operations Director undertook a trip to Georgetown to further evaluate the possibility. After meeting with local officials and health professionals, the focus shifted to the possibility of providing more specialized care,

The initial trip was then followed up by a visit from our Medical Relief Chair. Through more detailed discussions, we identified surgical intervention as an area where we could extend help, with a particular emphasis in the realm of plastic surgery and otolaryngology (ENT).



Guatemala (November 2024)

IMANA's Operations Director traveled to Guatemala to further expand of our Medical Relief program this year. With a goal to evaluate the needs and feasibility of conducting primary care missions, he connected through BDesh Foundation, one of our existing partners, with the mayor and staff of the Palencia Municipality.

It became apparent that there is significant lack of healthcare infrastructure in the rural, low-income areas, even close to the capital city, where we could extend our help. IMANA plans to start conducting medical missions in the year 2025.

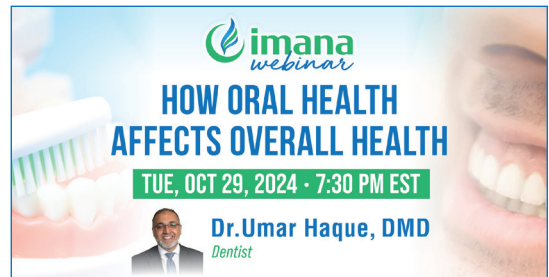


Empowering, Educating, Elevating: Our Impactful Webinar Series

In 2024, we achieved significant milestones in advancing medical education through joint Continuing Medical Education (CME) initiatives, fostering collaboration with leading experts. These efforts not only expanded opportunities for professional development but also introduced innovative formats and subjects to enrich healthcare professionals' knowledge and skills. Among the most notable include a CME workshop focused on disaster relief with Dr. Shakaib and DAANA as well as our first collaborative Learning Management System (LMS) course in partnership with Dr. Padela, focusing on bioethics.

Additionally, our CME and Webinar Programs worked together to integrate availability of CME credits for our webinar viewers. These webinars hosted with expert speakers offered viewers insights into better healthcare practices.

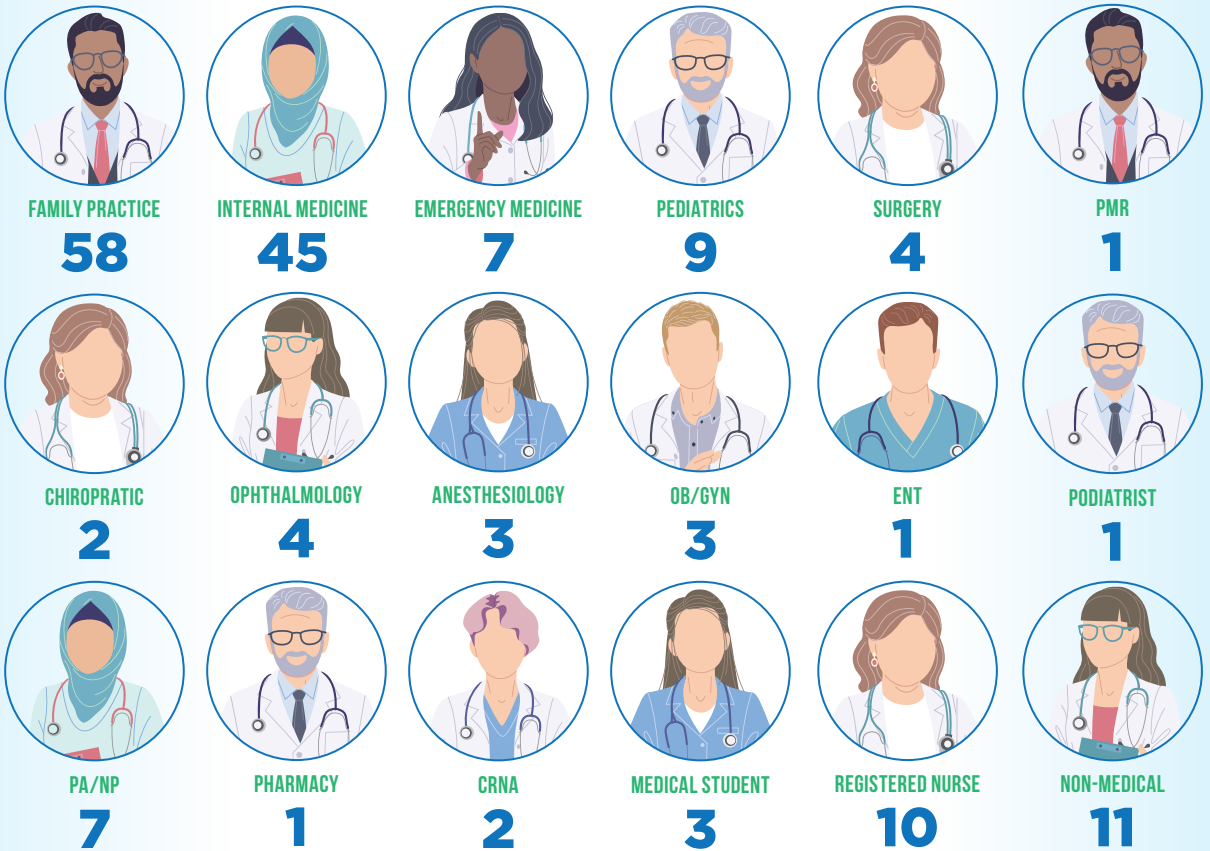

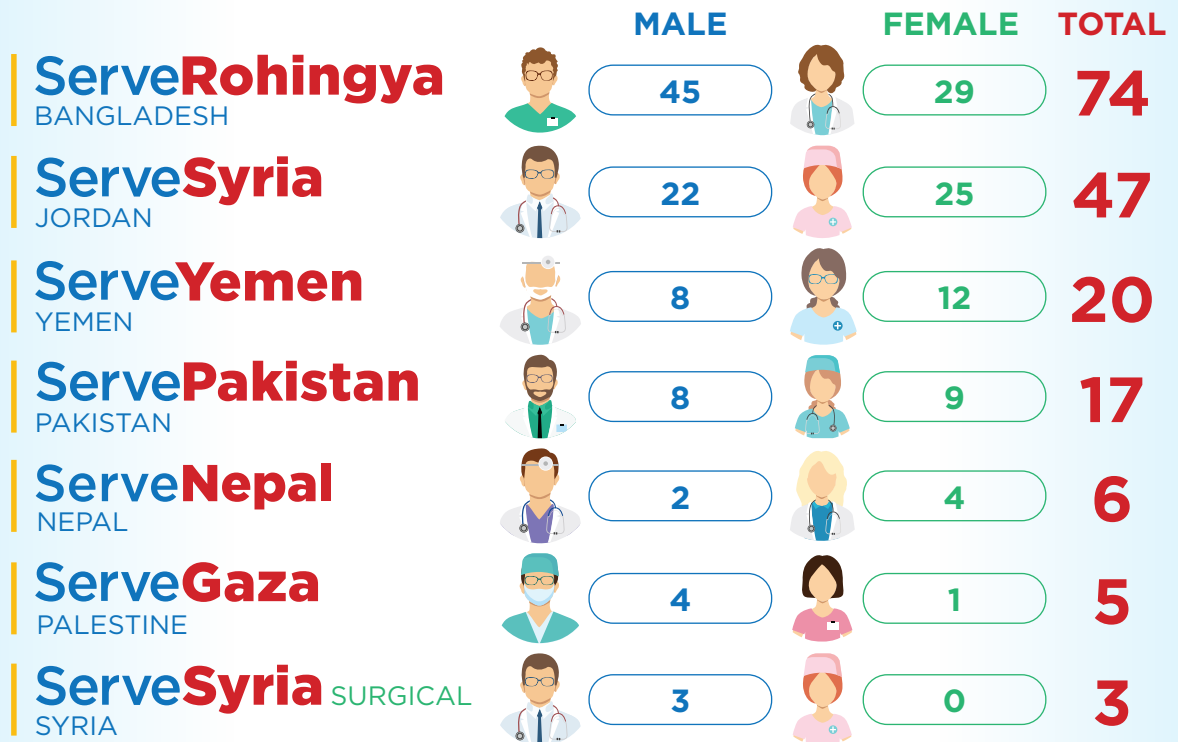

401(k) Plans

IMANA offers a 401(k) retirement program that has been custom-built for IMANA members. The Plan offers a wide range of investment options, including a number of Shariah-compliant funds.

Contributions are taken directly from employees' paychecks and employees can decide how much to contribute. The Plan offers competitive fees, comprehensive administrative and compliance services, and a high-touch service model to reduce the burden on members' Human Resources and Finance teams.

Cash Balance Plan

A Cash Balance plan is a trustee-directed defined benefit plan that specifies both the contribution to be credited to each participant and the investment earnings to be credited based on those contributions. Cash Balance plans are generally best suited for small businesses whose owners have contributed the maximum to their 401(k) Plan and are looking for additional tax-deferred savings opportunities.

Health Savings Accounts (HSA's)

An HSA is a tax-advantaged medical savings account paired with a qualified high deductible plan (HDHP) used to pay for qualified medical expenses. With the tax advantages of an HSA, contributions (employer and employee) are made pre-tax, earnings are tax-free, and distributions for eligible expenses are tax-free. Employees can save more money for retirement by investing in an HSA.
